### **General Information**

#### Kitchen

- Hot plates, electric skillets, and grills are not permitted in the casita.
- Microwave and a small dining table are available.
- There is an outdoor patio table; feel free to bring a small grill.

#### The Casita is a Non-Smoking Unit

• Smoking is permitted outside of the casita.

#### Lake Meredith

- Water level at Lake Meredith is extremely low due to current drought conditions; as a result, water activities, such as paddle boarding, kayaking, swimming, fishing, and boating are not recommended.
- However, take the trail 100 yards to the sun shelter and enjoy the beautiful surroundings.

#### Wildlife

- Bird watching at Lake Meredith and Three Dog Night is spectacular any time of year. Look for hummingbirds, finches, wrens, woodpeckers, bluebirds, mockingbirds, killdeer, herons, eagles, ducks, geese, stilts, egrets, sandpipers, and pelicans.
- Look for a doe and her twin fawns and an occasional coyote or bobcat.
- Be ever aware of the occasional bullsnake or rattlesnake. It's safest to stick to the trail.
